Students will deepen their understanding from a broad perspective that integrates the elements that make up history, including politics, economics, society, culture, and the international environment.				
Style	The course will be taught mainly with lectures, using note-taking, textbooks, pictorial books, and handout.				
Notice	Although memorizing words and events is important, this course goes beyond it and aims to deepen the students' understanding toward the structure, cause, and effect of historical events and help them understand the today's situation and social structure by linking with it. Students who miss 1/3 or more of classes will not be eligible for a passing grade.
