Teaching Method							
Outline	General or Specialized : General Field of learning : Japanese language Foundational academic disciplines : Humanities/Literature, linguistics Relationship with Educational Objectives : This class is equivalent to "(5) Attain a global perspective and understanding of social development." "(7) Develop communication and presentation abilities." Relationship with JABEE programs : The main goals of learning / education in this class are "(F), also "(B)" is involved. Course outline : This is an intensive class for first-year international students. Students will learn about Japanese culture and manners so that they will be able to live and study in Japan smoothly in the future. Students will also deepen their understanding of Okayama Prefecture and Tsuyama City. One of the goals is to make use of what they learn in class and in their daily lives to blend in with their surroundings. Students will also develop their ability to collect necessary materials, select and choose the information they need, summarize it, and make a presentation.						
Style	Course method : We will deepen our learning on the following topics in the form of classroom lectures and practical (training) 1. Japan and World War II 2. About the Japanese New Year Yayoi Town Mochi Pounding Festival, Homestay, New Year's calligraphy 3. About Okayama Prefecture 4. About Our Town Tsuyama Relationship between Tsuyama and Western Studies, History of Tsuyama National College of Technology 5. Manners in Japan - about honorific language 6. Japanese for health They will be asked to write a report on each topic in Japanese, which will be evaluated. Grade evaluation method : Assignments (70%), presentation (20%), and attendance (10%) will determine the overall evaluation. A score of 60 or more is considered a passing grade, and the student will not be required to retake the exam.						
Notice	Precautions on the enrollment : Students must take this class (no more than one-third of the required number of class hours missed) in order to complete the 1st year course. Course advice : Students should study up to Lesson 30 of "Minna no Nihongo Shokyu II (2nd Edition) " in advance and understand the contents of the study. There is a lot to learn, so students should prepare and review every day. We also want students to have an interest in the Japanese language and culture. Foundational subjects : Japanese language courses taken in my home country and training to prepare for study abroad. Related subjects : Japanese language I (1st year), Japanese writing(1st year), Japanese conversation and listening I (1st year), Japanese language II (2nd year), Japanese conversation and listening II (2nd year), Japanese language III(3rd year) Attendance advice : Actively participate in class and submit all assignments on time. Try to look up vocabulary you don't understand. Make an effort to find out information about Japan outside of class time. The content of the class will change depending on the class.
