For the final evaluation at the end of the academic year, the results of the above method are added to the final examinations, converted to 90%, and the results of the GTEC (only reading and listening score in this subject) are added to the evaluation by 10%. Students are not allowed to bring textbooks and notes to the exam. In some cases as diseases, the supplementary exams will be performed.
