Outline	General or Specialized : General. Course outline : Activities will be conducted as foundational inputs (listening and reading), with special attention to vocabulary and grammar skills. The student will learn to comprehend the content of the English textbooks in various fields. In the process, student will include output such as reading exercises and responses in English as appropriate.					

Style	<p>Course method : (YAMAGUCHI Yumi) The students exercises to grasp the meaning of English accurately in context. Reading is practiced with textbooks and exercises. In addition, through reading exercises in several times, and paired discussions, the student will be able to communicate in English. The student will also develop practical skills for the foreign language examinations including GTEC.</p> <p>(YAMAGUCHI Hitoshi) Basic listening, pronunciation and communication skills are practiced. Recite example sentences, learn grammar points, and practice writing exercises. Listening and pronunciation practice. Recitation of example sentences, study of grammatical matters, and practice of writing in English.</p> <p>Grade evaluation method: From the first semester to the second semester, students will be graded on the average of the regular examinations (60%). Students will be graded based on the results of the examinations, quizzes, assignments, and the daily notebook (40%). For the final evaluation at the end of the academic year, the results of the above method are added to the final examinations, converted to 90%, and the results of the GTEC (only reading and listening score in this subject) are added to the evaluation by 10%. Students are not allowed to bring textbooks and notes to the exam. In some cases as diseases, the supplementary exams will be performed.</p>
Notice	<p>Precautions on the enrollment : This is a mandatory course for completion of the academic year. It is a course offered throughout the academic year.</p> <p>Course advice: be sure to work on the prep, review and assignments as they are instructed; be sure to take the GTEC; and be sure to take the course with the students.</p> <p>Foundational subjects : English I (1st year), English Expressions I (1st), English Expressions II (2nd)</p> <p>Related subjects: English III (3rd), English IV (4th), International English I (4th), International English II (4th), English V (5th)</p> <p>Attendance advice : You must actively participate in the classes. The lectures and activities of reading aloud and reading comprehension will provide a basis for improving the students' operational skills. Students are required to bring their textbooks, preparation notes, and an English-Japanese dictionary to class. Students must take the GTEC during the midterm examinations. Students are encouraged to take qualifications and examinations such as TOEIC, or EIKEN. Please do not enter the room after the start of class as it will interfere with your learning.</p>
