Grade evaluation method: Students who have achieved Eiken Grade 2 must notify the instructor in charge and apply for credit to the Educational Affairs Committee by the separately instructed date and time during the academic year. The Academic Affairs Committee will deliberate on the matter, and if credit is granted, the grade will be "Pass".

Notice		Precautions on the enrollment :Students must submit an application for elective courses by the designated date. In addition, this course is a qualifying course, and students must apply for credit in order to receive credit.
