For the second examination, students who wish to take the examination will be given personal interview guidance.

Grade evaluation method: Students who have achieved Eiken Grade 2 must notify the instructor in charge and apply for credit to the Educational Affairs Committee by the separately instructed date and time during the academic year. The Academic Affairs Committee will deliberate on the matter, and if credit is granted, the grade will be "Pass".
