Outline	General or Specialized : Specialized Field of learning : Japanese Foundational academic disciplines : Literature, linguistics / Japanese literature, Japanese linguistics Relationship with Educational Objectives : This class is equivalent to "(1) Cultivate human creative talent, rich in practical abilities". Course outline : To understand how Japanese people at that time looked at other cultures through the appreciation of works and travelogues by modern writers that are set in foreign countries. Through comparisons between modern and contemporary cultures, and between Japan and other cultures, students will reevaluate their own culture and consider how to deal with other cultures.					
Style	Course method : Reading of the works, lectures and exchange of opinions about the works and authors. Themes will be set for each content, and assignments and reports will be given. Grade evaluation method : Assignments (50%) + Report (50%). No regular examination.

Classes are offered for 15 hours per credit, but 30 credit hours are required in addition to this. Students are expected to actively participate in class and make an effort to improve their own expressive ability.
